



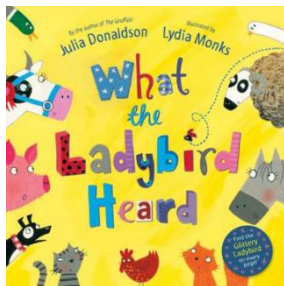
# Hi Reception!



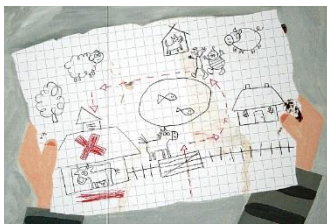
I think you are all 'Superstars', especially after hearing about all the lovely things you have been doing at home when I rang you last week. Don't forget to practise your reading each day.
