

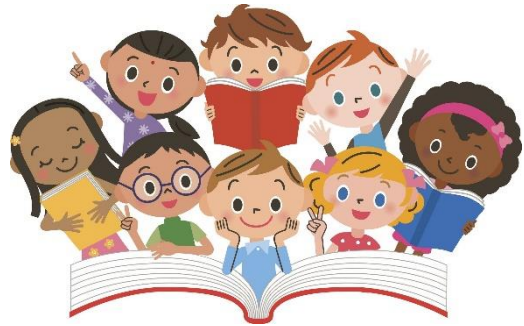
Supporting your child with English at home
