



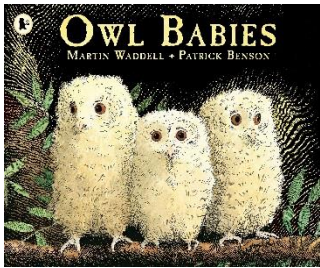
# Hi Reception!
