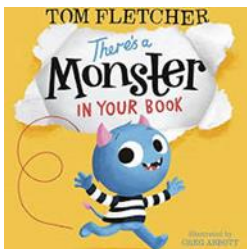

I have never read 'There's a monster in your book' before so it is a new story for me this week. If I wrote a speech bubble for the Monster it would say, 'I love this book'. I would have to use my Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonics to help me. Have a look at the book of the week tab, Week 14 for some other writing ideas.



The monster has a stripy jumper on! It is a repeating pattern. You could make a repeating pattern pasta necklace to wear. Count out 20 pieces of pasta and colour 10 in one colour and 10 in another. Make sure the string is long enough and create a repeating pattern.
