



# Hi Reception!



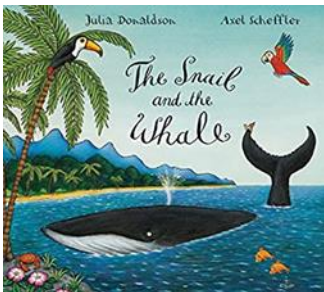

Drawing and labelling the whale and the snail sounds like a nice writing activity to do. Have a look at the book of the week tab, Week 15 for some other writing ideas.



I wonder if you have any snails hiding in your garden! You now know to look for a snail trail. Maybe it will take you to a snail. If you find one, look carefully at its shell. What patterns can you see? You could draw the snail and give it a name.



These snails are made out of a paper plate. You could just draw round a plate for the circle and cut it out. You can create another repeating pattern for the shell. You will be an expert by now!
