The setting

The children 'Explore and Learn' in our indoor and outdoor areas. Carefully planned and resourced areas ensure that the children develop the skills to become good learners.

There are specific areas of provision including:

- Reading corner
- Role play
- Maths area
- Construction



There is however lots of overlap, as the children are encouraged to apply the skills they have been taught independently and in purposeful situations.





Our Curriculum

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework (EYFS).

We focus on developing the whole child through the seven areas of learning as well as developing the characteristics of learning.

The Prime Areas of Learning are - Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The Specific Areas of Learning are - Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design



A Day in the Life of our Reception Class

- Each day begins at 8:55am when the children come into school and self register.
- We have a daily phonics sessions when your child will learn the sounds needed for reading and writing.
- We have whole class maths and literacy sessions each day.
- Focused tasks which are taught in smaller groups also take place.
- We always have story time at the end of the day.
- The children explore and learn throughout the day.
- Our weekly PE session takes place on a Tuesday.





Keeping your child safe and healthy

Milk and fruit is provided each morning. You will need to register and pay for your child's milk at coolmilk.com Milk is free until the week before your child's 5^{th} birthday.

The children have access to water throughout the day.

Outdoor learning - Waterproof coats, trousers, wellies and fleeces are provided.

The TAs are paediatric first aiders

Medication - Asthma inhalers are kept in class. There is a form to complete if prescription medicine needs to be administered in school time.

Only named adults will be allowed to collect your child at the end of the day.



Lunchtimes

- Mrs Harrison looks after the Reception children at lunchtime.
- · All children are entitled to a universal infant (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) free school meal.
- To ensure that your child has a dinner that they like, you will select the menus for each half term.
- If your child brings a lunch from home it will be stored on a trolley in the corridor.
- · After the children have eaten their dinner they go onto the big playground.


Cool Milk


Your child will start to gain all the nutritional benefits from a daily serving of chilled milk in the classroom.






Nursery Visits
